PASTOR'S MOMENT

A message from our Senior Pastor, Rev. Myron Rhodes, Jr.

Greetings, Grace Wesleyans!

As we reach the end of Lent and the start of Eastertide, it is a good time to recap where we are in the church calendar. For many Christians, there are "high water" marks of Christmas (celebrated at the end of Advent), Easter (celebrated at the end of Lent, which begins with Ash Wednesday), and maybe Pentecost (celebrated 50 days after Easter). There are many lesser-known important dates on the church calendar, but most Christians just know them as "words" spoken sometimes during the year. These words usually include Epiphany, Transfiguration Sunday, All Saints Day, Christ the King Sunday, and perhaps Annunciation and Ascension. No doubt, you have heard of all of these things in your Christian life. Perhaps you know what they all are, or maybe not.

I plan to address all of these through *Growing with Grace* in the coming year. It is my goal for you to become knowledgeable of all of the important holy days, and days of significance to our Christian faith. For this, the first issue of *Growing with Grace*, I want to focus on the significant dates we will encounter in the month of April. These begin for us with Palm Sunday, and the Holy Week events of Holy (Maundy) Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter.

Palm Sunday is the date we celebrate Jesus' arrival into Jerusalem for the celebration of Passover. It is one of three traditional Jewish annual pilgrimages. Passover is the week-long celebration of the people of Israel being freed from bondage to Egypt and is mostly associated with putting the blood of a lamb on the doorposts of the Hebrew people so the angel of death will "pass over" their homes. Jesus enters Jerusalem with people shouting "blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord," which is normally shouted "Hosanna." There are many events detailed in the gospels about Jesus' last week in Jerusalem. Holy Thursday is the day we celebrate the institution of the Lord's Supper, or Eucharist, in the upper room. It is sometimes called Maundy Thursday, but the latter designation is normally only applied when there is actually foot washing during the service. When only Holy Communion is celebrated, it is called Holy Thursday.

The next event of the week is Good Friday. Many people wonder why it is called "good" when it is the day Jesus was killed on the cross. It is called Good Friday because of the ancient meaning of the word good, which was "holy" or "pious." Thus, it is the holy activity of Jesus taking our sins upon himself and to the cross that is good about Good Friday. Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday make up what is called the Triduum and are the three most important days up to Easter. We do not normally celebrate Holy Saturday in the faith tradition that many of us are most familiar with, but perhaps we will do so in the future sometime since we have services on Saturday anyway. But not this year.

Holy Week ends with the foundational part of the Christian faith story, and that is Christ resurrected on the third day...Easter Sunday morning! Jesus provides us with the great hope of our faith: a promised future with God via Christ's victory over sin and death. As we make our way through Holy Week this year, we might find time daily to read in Luke, beginning in 19:29, so we can be reminded of Christ's activity day by day in Jerusalem. Scripture can make this special time come alive for us if we will take the time to "tune in" and be a part of the story. That is my hope for you this month during Holy Week. Allow it to come alive for you!

Happy April...happy Holy Week...and happy Easter to you! Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!

We provided

- (1) 156 pairs of eyeglasses for Dr. Lang's program for the homeless at Hope South Florida. And we are still collecting!
- (2) 6,167 diapers+ wipes for God's Little Lambs and Hope South Florida. We collected in May and December.
- (3) Judy Ambrose's shoe project resulted in 75 \$15 Target Gift Cards that were part of the May diaper collection.
- (4) August saw us fill 109 Backpacks with necessary school supplies plus T shirts w/ collars for the children of families working with Hope South Florida.
- (5) October was our "hoodie" month as cooler weather set in. The support was outstanding as 91 hoodies of all sizes were received.

Two in-person meetings were held. Working around COVID was a challenge. However, the Holy Spirit was at work to make 2021 a success! A HUGE THANK YOU FOR YOUR GENEROUS SUPPORT!

2022 is already off to a great start!

This was GEMS™ first time to support the project to collect items needed for the portable showers at Hope South Florida, and so many joined in. It's time to report the results; we collected 461 towels plus an even greater number of wash cloths, 36-gallon size detergent containers + 15 smaller size bottles. Pery Canan tells us that this will cover at least the next 8 to 9 month's needs. A HUGE Thank You to all!

We now have an opportunity to help some very special furry friends in Ukraine and in Florida through IFAW (International Fund for Animal Welfare) and the Broward Humane Society.
